COOKIES POLICY

This cookie policy provides information about our use of cookies on the CIS website, and how you can manage the use of the cookies.

1. What is a cookie?

A cookie is a small text file that a website, app, or other internet site inserts into your computer, tablet, smartphone, or other similar device, containing information about your browsing or usage, such as a tag that identifies your device. Cookies are necessary, for example, to make navigation easier and to know how users interact with websites in order to improve them. They are also useful for delivering advertising based on user preferences, as well as for other purposes detailed below. Cookies do not harm your computer or device.

When we refer to "cookies" we are also referring to other similar technologies for setting and/or collecting information such as flash cookies, web beacons or bugs, pixels, HTML5 (locally stored), and SDK technologies for application formats. The term "cookies" also applies to the use of fingerprinting techniques, that is, techniques for combining information that helps us identify your device. These technologies sometimes work in conjunction with cookies to collect and store information, either to provide you with certain features or services on our website or to display advertising on third party websites, based on your browsing.

This explanation is a summary of what is meant by cookies for your information. The specific cookies we use are detailed in the cookie control panel on our website.

2. What types of cookies are there?

Please read this section for an overview of the types of cookies that may be used in an online environment.

Depending on the owner of the cookies, they can be classified as follows:

- a. Internal cookies:** Those are the ones sent to the user's computer or device from a device or domain managed by the publisher itself, and from which the website or service requested by the user is offered.
- b. Third party cookies:** Those are the ones sent to the user's computer or device from a device or domain that is not managed by the publisher, but by another entity that processes the data obtained through the cookies.

Depending on the purpose of the cookies, they can be classified as follows:

- a. Strictly necessary (technical) cookies:** Those are the ones that allow the user to navigate a website, internet site or application and use the various options or services offered: traffic control, data identification or for connection, access to restricted sections or contents, memorization of the elements that make up an order, execution of the purchase process of an order, payment management, fraud control related to the security of the service, the use of security elements during navigation, the request for registration or participation in an event, the storage of content for the broadcasting of videos or sounds, the implementation of dynamic content (for example, an animation for the loading of a text or an image) or the sharing of content through social networks. Technical cookies, being strictly necessary, are downloaded by default when they allow the website to be displayed or provide a service requested by the user.

b. Functionality or personalization cookies: Those are the ones that allow information to be memorized so that the user accesses the service or website with certain characteristics that may differentiate his/her experience from that of other users, such as, for example, the language, the number of results to be displayed when the user performs a search, the appearance or content of the service according to the type of browser of the user or the region from which he/she accesses the service, etc. Rejecting these cookies may result in a slower website or inappropriate recommendations.

c. Analysis cookies: Those are the ones that allow us to determine the number of users, the sections visited on the website and the way they interact with it, in order to measure and statistically analyze how users use the website, in order to introduce improvements based on the analysis of this usage data.

d. Behavioral advertising cookies: Those are the ones that store information on the behavior of users, obtained through the continuous observation of their browsing habits, making it possible to create a specific profile to show advertisements corresponding to them. These cookies allow to manage, in the most efficient way possible, the advertising spaces included by the publisher, directly or in collaboration with third parties.

3. Why do we use cookies on our website?

The main purpose of our cookies is to make your navigation as pleasant and efficient as possible. They are, for example, used to remember your preferences (language, country) during navigation and on future visits. We also use our cookies to improve our services and our website.

The information collected in the cookies also allows us to improve our website through estimates of statistical data and usage patterns (number of visits, most visited sections, length of visit, etc.), to learn through statistical indicators how users interact with our website in order to improve our services, as well as to tailor our website to your individual interests, speed up searches, etc.

In any case, the cookies we use never store sensitive information such as passwords, payment data, personal data, etc.

4. How can I manage the use of cookies on this website?

In the cookie control panel, which is accessible when you visit our website, you can obtain information about the cookies used.

Finally, if you are browsing the Internet, you can disable cookies in your browser. We show you how to do this in the most popular browsers:

- Google Chrome
- Internet Explorer
- Mozilla Firefox
- Safari

This option to avoid the use of cookies can be done at any time.

Please keep in mind that your cookie control panel and your option to decline cookies are specific to each browser you use. Therefore, if you choose to set cookies in a certain way on one device and want your option to be applied in a similar way to another device, you will need to enable the same option for that other device.

5. Who uses the information stored in cookies?

Our website uses cookies. These files stored on your computer are used to make it easier for you to access the services we offer. The site's cookies do not contain information that can identify you personally, but they do record information about your visit to the site. They are designed to be used only by CIS. We inform you that you can prevent the recording of these "cookies" by configuring your computer according to the methods detailed on the site <http://www.cnil.fr>.
